NAIDOC WEEK ACTIVITIES




On Monday the 26th June, the students of St Joseph's School participated in activities to celebrate NAIDOC week. They rotated through each class and did an activity with each of the teachers.

In the Year 1/2 class they read the story of the rainbow serpent, which is an indigenous dreamtime story about how they believe the earth and humans were created. The students then created a giant rainbow serpent out of drawings done by every student.

In the 3-6 class the students created a digeridoo using the painting technique of dot painting. A digeridoo is a musical instrument made by indigenous Australians out of wood.

In the K/PP room we did dot painting on bark, to symbolise the way indigenous Australians use painting to tell the stories of their culture and pass down these stories to their children. The students came up with their own stories and created dot paintings to tell these stories; we even had Father Hyginus come in and paint one too!



JULY 2017: Month of the Most Precious Blood

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Saviour shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."
